





## Community Pharmacy NHS Smoking Cessation Service (SCS)












- > 4000 community pharmacists registered to deliver SCS
- > 50 NHS Trusts live with the pathway
- > 600 referrals into community pharmacy
- > 50% quit rate for individuals who engage with the service

### MLCSU SCS team

Following the successful NHS England SCS pharmacy integration pilot, MLCSU was commissioned to provide implementation support across England. Rob Hebdon, senior pharmacist, MLCSU (April 2022-Sept 2022) set up and led the original MLCSU implementation team.

### Patient Case Studies

#### Mr Smith, aged over 60

- Referred on 23/12/20
- Smoked for 52 years, started at 17
- Quickmist
- Remained abstinent post-discharge
- Fortnightly telephone support
- 12 week quit recorded 12/3/21

"'I feel like my health has improved...feel fitter and better. I am so happy that you have done this for me [and am] very appreciative"

#### Mr Khan, aged over 60

- Referred on 1/3/21
- Started smoking at 11
- Enjoyed smoking & had resisted all previous attempts to quit from hcps
- Personalised support and tailoring stop smoking messages to his experience were what made the difference, with weekly telephone support
- 12 week quit recorded 3/6/21

"Nadia built both my confidence and my purpose, she made me believe that I could stop smoking and made me see that if I did quit smoking it would prolong my life and give me more time with my grandchildren – they are the whole world for me"



#### Ms Batty, aged over 60

- Referred on 8/9/21
- Smoked for 46 years, started at 13
- Several unsuccessful previous quit attempts
- Initially declined support in hospital, but was 'won over' by the dedication of the CURE team
- NRT patches & lozenge
- Remained abstinent postdischarge
- Fortnightly telephone support
- 4 week quit recorded 30/9/21
- 12 week quit in 29/11/21

"I am so proud of myself and tell everyone I have kicked the habit and that something good has come out of going to hospital"







### Pharmacies engaged


#### Wolverhampton

- Only community-based smoking cessation service in Wolverhampton
  - No local authority service
- limited to inpatients
- outpatient support limited to self help
- 17 pharmacies delivering the Community Pharmacies' Advanced Service in smoking cessation

#### **Out-of-area referrals**

- Wallsall, Dudley and South Staffordshire all have 2 x community stop smoking services:
  - pharmacies delivering the community pharmacies' Advanced Service in smoking cessation PLUS
  - · local authority commissioned stop smoking services
- Walsall 17 pharmacies, Dudley 4 pharmacies, South Staffordshire 12 pharmacies
