


Core20: Above-average smoking rates among the most deprived reduces their healthy life expectancy and increases pressure on the NHS



In England a third of all smokers live in the most deprived two deciles.¹ In NHS North East London ICB there are 193,000 smokers and 24% of people in routine and manual occupations smoke. Smoking costs your ICB £59.6M a year.²

Annually in your ICB smoking causes:

- 7,864 hospital admissions.³
- 1,309 premature deaths.⁴

Additional impact on communities in your ICB:

- 84,244 smoking households live in poverty.⁵
- 9,751 people out of work due to smoking.⁶
- 26,300 people receive informal care from friends and family because of smoking.⁷

PLUS: The most deprived groups have the highest smoking rates


National smoking rates among:

- People who are homeless (77%).⁸
- People entering prison (80%).⁹
- 11–16-year-olds with a mental disorder (22%).¹⁰
- People in social housing (26%).11

Smoking rates for those receiving addiction treatment in your ICB:

- Those receiving treatment for opioid addiction (73%).¹²
- Those receiving treatment for alcohol addiction (44%).¹³
