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

Cost-Benefit and Public Finances Model of Smoking


- Estimates the total costs of smoking to the UK and its constituent countries (in current year and future years)
- Estimates the overall impact of smoking on the public finances (taking into account tax receipts, social security spending and other public spending)
- Models the impact of changes in smoking prevalence (e.g. due to tobacco control policies) on total costs of smoking and the public finances

Economic and social costs of smoking, UK: 2023 £89.3 billion


Modelling the impact of tobacco policy recommendations in England: what's included

- Implementation of current DHSC commitments and sustain them throughout the next parliament
- Implementation of NHS Long Term Plan commitments and sustain them throughout the next parliament
- Implementation of additional APPG recommendations throughout the next parliament

Modelled impact of tobacco policy recommendations on smoking prevalence in England



Impact of recommendations on public finances (England, £ million)

| | 2024 | 2025-29 average | 2025-29 cumulative |

| Reduced revenue from tobacco taxation | -134 | -1,011 | -5,054 |
| Higher tax receipts from increased productivity | +149 | +1,117 | +5,583 |

| Reduced social security spending | +47 | +364 | +1,819 |
| Reduced spending on public services | +23 | +159 | +794 |
